• As the current year of Irish Aid funding comes to an end, please pray for a smooth transition to the next year of the project and for the remaining funding that we need to continue the work to become available.

• Pray for people around the world who are separated from their families because of conflict, poverty and disease. Pray for those who are mourning the loss of loved ones, or feel alone. And pray for the work Tearfund Ireland is doing to promote healthy relationships in families, so that home can be a safe place.

• Lebanon: Please join us in praying for our partners in Lebanon where lockdown measures are having a devastating impact on refugees who depend on going out to work to survive.

• The United Nations recently warned of multiple famines as a result of the Coronavirus. Pray for the many millions of people around the globe who have little or no access to food.
