World News

Cambodia: We are delighted that a representative from our partner organisation in Cambodia will visit Ireland to take part in events and visit churches in late March. Please pray as we plan for the visit and for the visa application process to go smoothly.

Middle East: As we have been praying for an end to the violence in the Middle East, so we thank God that the ceasefire has come into effect. Pray for the ceasefire to hold, for all hostages to be released, for the safe delivery of aid, and for lasting peace in the region.

Ethiopia: Our CEO, Sean has been visiting partners in Ethiopia. He shares: "All the partners speak of the deteriorating security situation within and across the country. There are many unresolved tensions following the outbreak of conflict in the northern regions two years ago and there are many places in which partners are restricted in travel and are unable to access some Self-Help Groups (SHGs) to follow-up with participants. However, a positive element in this situation is that a several people who were formerly associated with the SHGs, now volunteer to assist the newer SHGs. In this region where two different groups are in conflict, the SHGs are left alone to continue because both opposing groups recognise that the SHGs are not trying to usurp their authority, they are "only doing good community development work." Thank God for the recognition of the work of SHGs and pray for an end to the conflict and peace to come.
